Lady Laroze - Saint-Emilion Grand Cru.

- It is the second brand of Château Laroze, *Grand Cru Classé* of 27-hectares (67-acre). It has been created in tribute to the women who counted in the history of the estate.
- Stringent selection from the various vineyard plots and a great attention to detail when we blend the wines together make this a Saint-Emilion Grand Cru.
- By tilling the soil, cultivating grass between the rows, draining and adding organic material to the land and refusing to use any form of weedkiller, we facilitate the penetration of the vines' roots into the silica and clay soil.
- We work in the respect of the ecosystems to improve biodiversity.
- Lady Laroze is vinified in the same conditions as Château Laroze.
- Lady Laroze's pure, fresh aromas accompany smooth harmony on the palate. Keeping potential: about eight years.
